Recipe: Lemon Meringue Pie

This was my Mum's signature recipe from the 1970s. It's a very budget friendly dessert. The recipe is easily adapted to suit gluten and dairy free requirements by replacing the shortcrust pasty with one that suits.

If you use a bigger flan dish, increase the quantity of filling.

Pastry	Lemon Filling	Meringue Topping
6oz/170g plain flour	3 tbsp cornflour	3 egg whites
4oz/113g butter/margarine	1⁄2 pint/275ml water	5oz/140g caster sugar
1 egg yolk	2 egg yolks	
l tbsp sugar	2 large lemons	
2 tsp water	2oz/50g caster sugar	

Method:

- 1. Make the pastry in usual way. Roll out the pastry and use to line a greased 20cm/8" flan ring placed on a baking sheet. Prick the base with a fork and rest the pastry for 20 minutes.
- 2. Place a circle of greaseproof paper and baking beans onto the pastry and bake blind at 200°C/ Fan 180°C/ 400°F/ Gas mark 6 for 15 minutes. Remove the paper and beans and allow to cool.
- 3. Reduce the oven temperature to 180°C/Fan 160°C / 350°F/Gas Mark 4.
- 4. Finely grate the rinds of both lemons, cut in half and squeeze the juice. Put the rind and juice in a bowl with the cornflour, add 2 tablespoons of the water into the cornflour mixture and mix well.
- 5. Boil the remaining water in a small saucepan and pour it onto cornflour mixture, stirring well. Return the lemon cornflour mixture to pan, bring to the boil and simmer for 3 minutes until thick, stirring regularly.
- 6. Remove from the heat and add egg yolks and sugar.
- 7. Cool slightly and spoon the lemon mixture into the flan case.
- 8. Whisk the egg whites until they form soft peaks. Add the sugar a teaspoon at a time, whisking well after each addition. Pipe or spoon meringue over the lemon filling, then bake for 30 minutes until the meringue is pale beige and crispy on the outside.

Can be served warm or cold

West Essex virtual hospital service

The new West Essex virtual hospital service is delivered by several partner organisations and is part of the West Essex Out of Hospital Care Model. Launched in December 2022, it allows patients with specific conditions to be cared for at their usual place of residence, including care homes.

Hickory, Dickory, Who?

Have you ever wondered about the origins of the unusual nursery rhyme Hickory, Dickory, Dock?

Well, they may lay closer to home than you might think!

The popular nursery rhyme has delighted millions over bygone centuries, and the exact words of the poem vary - but, whichever words you remember, there is a great deal to the story behind it. The history of this simple children's tune is far from simple - but surprisingly relevant to Felsted.

The sounds of the poem are intended to mimic the ticking and chiming of a clock; so much so, across the world parents and teachers often use it to introduce children to the telling of time. There are at least two different tunes for the song, originating in the 19th century, when sheep farmers in Northwest England would count their herd using "Hevera (8), Devera (9), and Dick (IO) from the ancient Cumbric language. Some say this counting method may, in fact, be part of the rhyme's origin.

Where does Felsted come in?

As many local people will know, between 1649-1658, Oliver Cromwell ruled over Britain as the Lord Protector of the republic. Before he died, his son Richard - who was a Felsted school alumni, along with his three brothers - was appointed to his father's post.

It could be said that Richard was not quite suited for the job. He was mouse-like and timid, earning nicknames such as Tumbledown Dick- a reputation not helped by his abrupt fall from

> power, when the monarchy was restored in 1660. He lasted only lasted nine months in his position before he resigned and left the country.

> > Many accounts attribute the words of Hickory, Dickory, Dock to our local alumni's place in history. The poem was formally published in Tommy Thumb's Pretty Song Book printed in 1744 - an anthology of forty nursery rhymes.

Then, it was spelled 'Hickere, Dickere Dock' and over the years, variations of the title and the words have surfaced around the world.

The Hundred Parishes area has been home to many creative people. The People section of www.hundredparishes.org.uk includes introductions to a number of artists, composers - and also authors.

Probably our best-known author was HG Wells (1866-1946) who lived for 18 years in Little Easton at 18th-century Easton Glebe. He was a prolific writer, best remembered for his science-fiction novel "War of the Worlds" which was written before he came to Little Easton. A later novel, "Mr Britling Sees it Through" was set in Little Easton.

"The Hundred and One Dalmatians" was written by Dodie Smith (1896-1990). From 1934, she lived in Finchingfield at The Barretts, a 16th-century thatched house in the tiny hamlet of Howe Street. Her children's novel, written in 1956, was made into a highly successful Disney animated film. An earlier novel "I captured the Castle", written in 1948, was adapted into a film in 2003. Smith's former home is marked by a blue plaque.

Another blue plaque, on 17th-century Rose Cottage in Stebbing, identifies the former home of Henry de Vere Stacpoole (1863 -1951) who was also a prolific author. He lived there for about 10 years in the early 1900s and during that time completed his best-known novel, "The Blue Lagoon". It has been made into a feature film several times.

Horham Hall in the parish of Thaxted was the home of novelist Evelyn Anthony (1926 – 2018) from 1968 to 1976 and then from 1982 until her death. Sixteenth-century Horham Hall is Grade I-listed and the cost of upkeep forced Evelyn and her husband to sell it, but they were able to re-purchase it when her royalties increased. Of her many novels, "The Tamarind Seed" was the best known. It was published in 1971 and made into a film in 1974, starring Julie Andrews and Omar Sharif.

Citizen Advice

Are you missing out?

It is estimated that UK households are missing out on £15 billion a year of means-tested benefits. Even if you feel you can manage, you have a right to claim your benefit

entitlements - sometimes claiming can also help you access other support. You can check quickly and easily, using an online benefit calculator such as the one on the UDC website:

https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/article/5078/Online-Benefit-Calculators If you don't have internet access, or need a little extra help, call our friendly advisers on 01799 618840 and they will carry out a benefit check for you.

Are you off-grid? Homes not connected to the gas grid may be eligible for a £200 Alternative Fuels Payment. If you have an electricity supplier, check your bank or energy account to see if you received the payment in February. If you're on a prepayment meter, vouchers should have been sent by text, email or post. If you don't have an electricity supplier or have not received the payment, you can apply now. But don't delay! Applications close 31st May. https://www.gov.uk/ apply-alternative-fuel-bill-support-if-not-automatic

Low-cost broadband - Ofcom figures show that just 5% of eligible families have signed up for 'Social Tariffs' - discounted packages for households on Universal Credit or other types of financial support. These offer superfast speeds for as little as £12 a month. For more information go to https://www.uswitch.com/broadband/guides/ broadband-deals-for-low-income-families/

Healthy start vouchers - Half of the eligible families in Uttlesford are missing out on vouchers for milk, vitamins and healthy food. These may be available to you if you are on a low income and are pregnant or have a child under the age of 4.. Speak to your midwife or health visitor or go to https://www.healthystart.nhs.uk/

Discounted Travel - If you've been claiming some income-related benefits for three months, you may be entitled to a Jobcentre Plus Travel Discount Card, which can cut the cost of rail and bus fares by up to 50%. Ask at your local Jobcentre Plus.

Nature Area News



As much has been going on in recent months on the nature area, we thought we would provide an update. For those not familiar with this spot, it is located off Station Road and covers 33 acres owned by the Parish Council. It includes the officially designated Wildlife Site of "Felsted Fen" (Ufd276), situated on the floodplain of the River Chelmer.

The nature area was created on land transferred to Felsted Parish Council following the development of Flitch Green. Similarly, on completion of the development underway on Station Road - where the new health centre is being built - several additional acres opposite the nature area will be transferred to the Parish as "public open space". This additional area will complement the nature area and safeguard the parish from further development on that land.

On the existing nature area, a variety of habitats are being developed throughout the site and these will be managed to encourage wildlife. This is a very long-term project which is being overseen by a Working Group including both members of the Parish Council and local resident volunteers.

To protect and encourage wildlife, residents are allowed to access many areas (including Footpath 59 and numerous permissive mown paths) but are discouraged from visiting certain areas. To facilitate dog walking, two dog waste bins are provided together with general rubbish bins. One is by Station Road and one by Footpath 59. Please do use the bins and ensure that dog waste is picked up as this helps to keep the Nature Area a lovely environment for all!



Management Plan - The services of an Environmental Consultant have been engaged who is due to visit the Nature Area in late spring. They will record habitats / ecological features present and a subsequent report will set out management options and suggested priorities.

Tree Planting - Heritage Fruit Trees - To help preserve the treasure of our fruit heritage, different varieties of fruit trees have been planted. Apple, cherry, pear, and plum have been selected, all chosen for their regional significance and genetic diversity.

They all come from local counties: Essex, Hertfordshire, Norfolk and Suffolk.

The Queen's Green Canopy - This was an initiative to honour the Platinum Jubilee of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Two oak trees were planted within the Nature Area at the start of 2022 and are marked with special commemorative plaques.

During the last few months 138 trees have been planted comprising alders, mountain ash and oak. The Working Group is extremely grateful to Uttlesford District Council who supplied the trees free of charge together with bare root plants consisting of hawthorn, field maple and Rosa Rogusa. These are now growing in various locations on the nature area.



Barn Owl Boxes

Log Perches

The barn owl population declined throughout the 20th century. To encourage nesting, the Nature Area Working Group has installed two barn owl boxes which have been placed in quieter areas since barn owls are sensitive to disturbance.

Sadly, a copper beech tree in the

This boundary realignment will not affect District or Parish Council boundaries, Felsted will remain a parish under Uttlesford District Council who will continue to be responsible for emptying our bins and deciding planning issues in Felsted. However, it will mean very different representation in Westminster.

Felsted Primary School



We have had another very busy term at Felsted Primary School ranging from school trips, whole school focus weeks and doing our bit for charity.

The Spring Term saw us take part in Science Week with the focus on 'Connections'. The children started the week with a visiting Space Scientist who showed them a variety of experiments using sound, electricity and rockets. We also attempted to send a message from Reception all the way to Year 6 using different methods such as making boats to send a message across water, thinking about suitable materials to pass a message, sending messages from a height, using light to communicate using morse code, seeing how far a message can travel at distance through vibrations, using forces such as catapults and finally using buzzers. This was a great whole school activity to show that Science is Fun!

We have changed the way that we approach Art in school and continue to raise its profile across the school. We also took part in an Art Week where each class had a different artist focus and worked to create a final piece in that style. This culminated in an Art Exhibition where we invited parents in to come and see the final products as well as the



processes used to create them. This was a resounding success.

We have had lots of different school trips and experiences this term!

Reception had a number of visitors from members of our school community as part of their People Who Help Us topic such as Doctors, Police and even Police Sniffer Puppies. Year 1 took a trip to Colchester Zoo to continue their learning about Rainforest Animals, Year 2 took an inspiring trip to Gainsborough House Museum and Gallery to further their Art learning and Year 3 went to Colchester Castle to learn about the Romans and the impact that they had on the town.

Year 4 went on a new trip to the Museum of Power to consolidate their science learning on power and Year 5 visited Braintree Museum as part of their learning about Victorian England.

We also took part in the Readathon as part of our World Book Week Celebrations where we raised over £900 by children being sponsored to read whatever they would like to! This money will go towards providing children in major children's hospitals with carefully chosen books and professional story-tellers, giving them a precious distraction and comfort at a time when it is most needed.

We finished the term with a very wet but successful Easter Egg hunt run by our PTFA where we raised £1000 which will be spent on sending the whole school on another trip to Frinton in June.

No Laughing Matter

Walk around some parts of parish - notably around the rear of the Memorial Hall, in public car parks or even along parts of the Flitch Way - and there's a good chance you'll see a scattering of small, silver metal cannisters.

These cannisters contained compressed nitrous oxide gas, better known as NOS or laughing gas, that has been used almost certainly by young people between the age of 16 and 24 to get a high.

When inhaled, usually through a balloon, nitrous oxide can make people feel happy, relaxed, dizzy and lead to hallucinations. Several doses can produce a longer dizzy feeling increasing the risk of people injuring themselves, especially in a rural area where users may also be young drivers. This is a major risk of taking the drug.

The government plans to make the recreational use of nitrous oxide illegal. If you see discarded containers, please let the parish council know about it, so we can collate the information and inform our neighbourhood policing team.

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' CORNER

Election News

District Council Election day has come and gone and sadly, Cllr Sandi Merifield will no longer be one of our District Councillors.

John Evans (Residents for Uttlesford – R4U) remains a District Councillor for the Ward of Felsted and Stebbing and is now joined as District Councillor by Richard Silcock (Liberal Democrat). The Election was keenly fought out among the three leading candidates and John, Sandi and Richard each secured some 25% of the votes cast – three quarters of the total between them, with John receiving 498 votes, Richard 487 and Sandi 470.

John and Sandi reached out to all areas of the Parish in the weeks leading up to the Election and spoke to a great many residents, whom they would like to thank for their support. Sandi now continues her many years' work as a Parish Councillor in Stebbing, as before. I thank her for her valued contribution and commitment as District Councillor throughout the past four years.

The Election results across the District as a whole may be found on the UDC website: https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/article/8431/Election-of-district-councillors-on-Thursday-4-May-2023 .

Accordingly, R4U remains as before the party having the administration of Uttlesford District Council, being the majority party with 22 elected Councillors returned out of a total of 39. Incidentally, R4U remains unique in the country, being a residents' non-national party, in their administration of a District Council.

Challenges Ahead

Development pressures will continue, given the Government's annual house building target in England of 300,000. The Government's required share of this annual total for Uttlesford is 701 dwellings pa – district wide – every year, until 2040. Uttlesford's population in the past 10 years has increased by about 16% and there is no sign that such demand and growth will decline, given the District's proximity to North and East London, and with good road and rail connectivity.

Continuing News

District Councillor surgeries will continue to be held immediately prior to the monthly Parish Council Meetings held in the URC Hall. Residents are very welcome – no appointment necessary. Detailed monthly reports are also submitted to the Parish Council and accessible via the PC Minutes. Feel free at any time to contact us with any questions or issues of concern.
